FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

Since health services are primarily a responsibility of the Provincial Governments, the Federal Government's responsibility for services for mentally defective persons applies only in special cases. In the Department of National Health and Welfare, the Directorate of Indian Health Services has been looking after the medical care of Indians on reservations. When mental defectives occur in this group, they are usually admitted to a provincial institution for care and training, and the Department of National Health and Welfare has been paying for their care on a negotiated per diem basis.
