about the hospital . . .

Famous as a centre of patient care, education and clinical research, the Royal Victoria Hospital is one of Canada's largest public general hospitals, with 850 beds and 115 bassinets.

The hospital was founded in 1887 by Sir George Stephen, later Lord Mount Stephen, and Sir Donald Smith, later Lord Strathcona, as a memorial to the fiftieth anniversary of Queen Victoria's reign. The charter for the hospital's incorporation was granted by "Her Majesty by and with the advice of the Senate and the House of Commons of Canada" on June 23, 1887.

Patterned after the Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh, the hospital's original buildings were formally opened on December 2, 1893, by the Governor-General of Canada, the Earl of Aberdeen. The first seven patients were admitted on January 2, 1894.

In addition to the Main Building, which was the original unit, the hospital's buildings include the Ross Memorial Pavilion, (built in 1916), the Women's Pavilion (1926), the Allan Memorial Institute of Psychiatry, (opened in 1944 and a 50-bed wing added in 1953), and the New Wing (completed in 1955). Each year at the hospital, 19,000 patients are

Each year at the hospital, 19,000 patients are admitted, 3,500 babies are born, 11,500 surgical operations are performed, and outpatient consultations in 33 medical, surgical and specialty clinics total 75,000.
